

SCCNZ Drivers Championship Regulations 2026-27



1. The aim of the championship is to encourage participation in SCCNZ events (and motorsport generally) and to recognise outstanding performance.
2. The championship will be contested across a minimum of 6 events. The events will be run by SCCNZ or other MSNZ-affiliated car clubs (events not run by SCCNZ are classified as external events). The schedule of events will be developed progressively throughout the year and notified to competitors via the SCCNZ website, via email and published on the SCCNZ Facebook page.
3. The championship is open to all financial members of the club during the period 1st June to 31st May each year. Championship points will only be awarded to financial members of SCCNZ.
4. Total championship points will be calculated as the sum of the competitor's scores for their best SIX events, irrespective of type (i.e. motorkhanas, autocrosses, sprints, hillclimbs, etc).
5. Points scored in a SCCNZ event are calculated as
$$\frac{[\text{Fastest SCCNZ members Time}]}{[\text{Competitor's Time}]} \times 100 \text{ points.}$$
6. For external events run by other clubs, the points score is calculated as
$$\frac{[\text{Fastest Time of the Day irrespective of Car Class or Group}]}{[\text{Competitor's Time}]} \times 100 \text{ points.}$$
7. No eligible competitor will be awarded less than 50 points per event. Should timing be unavailable for an event, each eligible competitor will be awarded 50 points.
8. A driver may compete in different vehicles in any number of events, but points scored will only accrue to the specific driver/vehicle combinations.
9. An update of championship points will be published after each SCCNZ event.
10. The top points scorer for the championship year will be awarded the Ron Elliot Shield at the club AGM. If less than 6 events are run the Ron Eliot Shield may not be awarded for that championship year.
11. Certificates of merit will be presented to the top 20 competitors at the AGM.
